

Synopsis Introduction

The book, "Last call?" is a collection of 41 essays, which were written by and/or collected by the author, because he believes some essential concepts, facts, and beliefs of Christianity are being glossed over by too many so-called-Christians. Furthermore, some varying interpretations of some concepts, facts, and beliefs have become points of contention between Christians. This has occurred, because most of these Christians find that it is easier to accept and profess the doctrinal line of their denomination and/or their religious leader(s), rather than reading the Bible for themselves and then testing the doctrines promoted by their denomination and/or religious leader(s) against what the Bible says. Consequently, in creating this book, the author hoped to accomplish two major objectives, which each had two parts. The first-two-part objective was: first, to get Christians to read the Bible and pray for the discernment of the Holy Spirit, and then to reflect on their beliefs and Christian observances to determine if they "are really serving God" and second, to get non-Christians to "check out God for themselves". The second-two-part objective was: first, to compose and/or collect some essays, which addressed some of the points of contention, between Christians and second, to compose and/or collect some essays, which might help Christians share their faith with non-Christians.
